SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

## 1 SEC. 2. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION DIVISION.

- 2 (a) In General.—Section 319 of the Federal Power
- 3 Act (16 U.S.C. 825q-1) is amended to read as follows:
- 4 "SEC. 319. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION DIVISION.
- 5 "(a) IN GENERAL.—There shall be a division within
- 6 the Office, to be known as the Public Participation Divi-
- 7 sion, administered by a Director appointed by the Director
- 8 of the Office.
- 9 "(b) Rate of Pay.—
- 10 "(1) DIRECTOR.—The Director shall be com-
- 11 pensated at an equivalent rate of basic pay pre-
- scribed for a director in the Office.
- "(2) Employees.—The Director may appoint,
- and assign the duties of, employees of such Division,
- and, with the concurrence of the Office, fix the com-
- pensation of such employees and procure temporary
- and intermittent services to the same extent as is
- authorized under section 3109 of title 5, United
- 19 States Code.
- 20 "(c) Duties of Director.—
- 21 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Subject to paragraph (2),
- the Director shall be responsible for the discharge of
- 23 the functions and duties of the Division, including—
- 24 "(A) coordinating assistance to the public
- 25 with respect to authorities exercised by the
- 26 Commission; and

1	"(B) coordinating assistance available to
2	persons intervening or participating or pro-

5	"(2) Limitation.—Any assistance coordinated

8	"(d) No Compensation for Certain Interve-
9	NORS OR PARTICIPANTS.—The Commission, including the
10	Director and the Division, may not, under rules promul-
11	gated by it, provide compensation for attorney's fees, ex-
12	pert witness fees, or other costs of intervening or partici-
13	pating in any proceeding before the Commission to any
14	person whose intervention or participation substantially
15	contributed to the approval, in whole or in part, of a posi-
16	tion advocated by such person.
17	"(e) Definitions.—In this section:
18	"(1) DIRECTOR.—The term 'Director' means
19	the Director of the Division.
20	"(2) Division.—The term 'Division' means the
21	Public Participation Division described under sub-
22	section (a).
23	"(3) Office.—The term 'Office' means the Of-
24	fice of External Affairs of the Commission.".

1	(b) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the date
2	of enactment of this Act, the Director of the Public Par-
3	ticipation Division, described in section 319 of the Federal
4	Power Act (16 U.S.C. 825q-1), as amended by subsection
5	(a), shall submit to the Committee on Energy and Com-
6	merce of the House of Representatives a report on—
7	(1) the actions and initiatives taken by the Di-
8	rector, including actions and initiatives taken to in-
9	crease public participation, pursuant to the authori-
10	ties provided in such section 319 of the Federal
11	Power Act;
12	(2) the results of taking the actions and initia-
13	tives described in paragraph (1); and
14	(3) how the authorities provided in such section
15	319 of the Federal Power Act may complement or
16	overlap any existing authorities of the Federal En-
17	ergy Regulatory Commission outside of the Division
18	with respect to engaging with landowners and inter-
19	ested parties under that Act.
