

**The REBUILD Act of 2013 – One Page Summary – Rep. Brett Guthrie (KY-02)**  
*Reducing Employer Burdens, Unleashing Innovation, and Labor Development Act*

The REBUILD Act is a top ten list of policy priorities that will stimulate production and increase our global competitiveness. A thriving manufacturing base is key to enhancing competitiveness, and this bill serves as a starting point for a comprehensive, bipartisan conversation about how best to serve the job creators who are the backbone of our economy.

**Title I – Investing in America’s Workforce**

- Provides for state and local workforce investment systems to use youth activities funds for training programs, and for priority to be given to training programs that lead to recognized postsecondary credentials that match high demand occupations and industries.

**Title II – R&D Tax Credit**

- Extends the tax credit for increasing research activities, and increases the alternative simplified tax credit to 20%, along with making it permanent.

**Title III – Comprehensive Tax Reform**

- Provides for expedited consideration of comprehensive tax reform legislation as long as it reduces the complexity of the tax code, eliminates special interest loopholes, and transitions to a more globally competitive corporate tax code.

**Title IV – Federal Oil and Gas Resources**

- Requires expansion of offshore oil and gas production to increase energy independence.

**Title V – Energy Consumers Relief**

- Requires EPA to report to Congress on the costs and benefits of any energy-related rule that would cost more than \$1 billion dollars prior to finalizing the rule, and would prohibit EPA from finalizing the rule if DOE determines that the rule will adversely affect the economy.

**Title VI – Repeal of the Health Care Law**

- Repeals Obamacare.

**Title VII – Portability of Individual Health Insurance Coverage**

- Authorizes consumers to purchase health insurance from issuers who are located in other states.

**Title VIII – Renewal of Trade Promotion Authority**

- Reauthorizes TPA for 5 years.

**Title IX – Reform of Export Control Policy**

- Expresses the sense of Congress that our export control laws are obsolete and should be reformed.

**Title X – Efficient Use of Government Spectrum**

- Gives federal agencies time to relocate from 1755-1780 MHz band and requires a commercial auction of additional bandwidth.
